#### **OVERVIEW OF PERFORMANCE TO DATE**

The mining industry recorded a disappointing 18% increase in fatalities in 2020 with 60 fatalities, compared to 51 in 2019. This is despite the shut-down and reduced operations during the early stages of lock-down in 2020.

The 2019 number of fatalities saw a significant reduction to a level never achieved in South Africa's mining history, a tribute to intensive collaboration between role players. However, 2020 saw a deterioration, even though fewer person hours were worked due to the COVID-19 lockdown. The impact that the COVID-19 pandemic may have had on safety performance as well as an introspection into the root causes of accidents is currently receiving urgent, intensive and detailed attention during 2021.

The industry however recorded a 26% decrease in injuries from 2,452 in 2019 to 1,814 in 2020 – the highest improvement recorded in the last five years, above the annual milestone reduction target of 20%.
